## Schluchtensteig Black Forest

stimulating, profound, wild.

### *Spirit of adventure*

You need to have a certain taste for adventure, and for some, covering the 119 kilometres of the Schluchtensteig in six consecutive stages will be a particular challenge. With daily stages of around 20 kilometres each, you still have to climb a total of more than 6,400 metres of elevation gain and loss. On the agenda: rocky trails and root-strewn paths in gorge forests resembling primeval forests, viewpoints and secure paths alongside waterfalls – a natural paradise for experienced hikers, who must be sure-footed and not prone to vertigo. Given that the Schluchtensteig trail connects the most beautiful gorges in the Southern Black Forest Nature Park. It also takes in easy paths through peaceful meadows and forests, as well as panoramic ridges offering breathtaking views of the Alps. This alternation between exciting rocky passages and peaceful hikes on high-altitude trails through gently sloping mountain meadows, natural peat bogs and forests is what makes the Schluchtensteig so charming, with new surprises around every corner.

# Good to know!

Everything you need to know at a glance



## Achieving your goal with the diamond

- The route is marked in both directions by diamond-shaped signs.
- Rescue zone signage helps determine your location in an emergency.



## Accommodation

- Accommodations located more than 2 km from the trail are either easily accessible by public transport or offer a shuttle service to/ from the trail.
- Short-term bookings are generally possible, but we recommend booking your accommodation in advance. Many accommodations are in high demand, especially on weekends, public holidays and during holiday periods. It is therefore best to book early.

## Tip

- Unlike many others, start your hiking week in the middle of the week.

## Equipment

- Clothing suitable for all weather conditions, good walking boots and walking poles are required.
- We recommend bringing at least 1.5 litres of drinks.

## The hiking pass

- Have you ever been caught up in the excitement of collecting?
- The hiking passport for the Schluchtensteig is available at all tourist offices and accommodation providers along the trail.
- You can obtain the seven required stamps at all tourist offices, accommodation establishments, and certain retail shops.
- At the end of the tour, a certificate and a small souvenir await you!

- Since 2008, the Schluchtensteig has been certified as a "Qualitätsweg Wanderbares Deutschland" (quality hiking trail in Germany).

## Current route information

- If a diversion is necessary due to forestry or road works, you will be informed on the Schluchtensteig website under "Current trail information".
- Uniform diversion signs, placed at the start and end of the diversion, help hikers find their way. The diversion route is also marked with the Schluchtensteigraute.
- Tip: Check the current road conditions on the website 1 to 2 days before your arrival to avoid any surprises.



## Schluchtensteig tours digital

Each stage description includes a QR code that allows you to download the route description and map directly to your smartphone.

You can find all stages of the gorge trail in the free Black Forest app (see QR code below), which you can also save offline.

You can also find the Schluchtensteig collection on Komoot (see QR code below).

Tip: download the stages offline, as there is not always network coverage in the gorges.



## Food & beverages

- All kinds of culinary delights await you along the trail. You can find information about dining options on our website.
- Please note the current opening hours and closing days.

## Hiking with a dog



- The path is easily passable with dogs.
- In the Schleifenbach Gorge near Blumberg (stage 2), the very steep descent via a ladder (approx. 8 metres high) can be difficult with large dogs. You can find a description of the detour on our website.
- Dogs must be kept on a lead.
- When booking, check whether dogs are permitted in the accommodation.

## The hiking cross of the south

In St. Blasien, south of Lake Schluchsee, the two long-distance hiking trails **Schluchtensteig** and **Albsteig Schwarzwald** intersect to form the **"Wanderkreuz des Südens" (southern trail cross)**. Hikers can thus rediscover these two long-distance trails by combining different sections. With the **Wolfswege Schwarzwald (Black Forest Wolf Trails)** project, a unique interactive educational and discovery centre offering hiking trails on the theme of wolves has been integrated into the **Wanderkreuz des Südens**:

# Access and mobility

## Starting point

- Stühlingen or Wehr, the trail is marked in both directions.

## KONUS



- In all towns along the Schluchtensteig trail (except Stühlingen), you can obtain the KONUS guest card from your accommodation provider. This card allows you to use regional buses and trains throughout the Black Forest free of charge.

## P Parking spaces

- Stühlingen: free parking near the municipal hall (a few minutes' walk from the starting point, near the Catholic church).
- Parking: parking spaces at the bus station, near the media library, in the underground car park and in the multi-storey car park (a few steps from the starting point in the castle gardens).
- PLEASE NOTE: only some of the parking spaces are unlimited in time!

- Allow approximately 2 hours for the transfer by bus and Hochrheinbahn train.

Wutach flood

Tour: ◀▶ 19 km ⌚ 5.5 hours ▲ 510 m ▼ 260 m



Stühlingen, located right on the Swiss border, is the starting point of our long-distance hiking trail – the gateway to an unforgettable adventure. The view of Hohenlupfen Castle, the town's emblem, sets the mood before the landscape captivates you as you walk along. In Weizen, you pass the station of the famous "Sauschwänzlebahn" railway. The nostalgic whistle of the steam locomotive will accompany you throughout this stage. In Lausheim-Blumegg, take a detour to the historic mill in the hamlet before the adventure really begins: you enter the spectacular rock faces of the Wutachflühen nature reserve. Here, the "Flühen" (= rocks) reveal their wild beauty: steep rock towers, gigantic ferns, mossy stones and gnarled roots show a "piece of the primeval forest" of the Southern Black Forest. On narrow and sometimes exposed paths, you will discover nature in its purest form – sure-footedness is essential here! Shady trees then accompany you on your ascent to the Buchberg viewpoint. From the rest area there, you can enjoy a breathtaking view of the Wutachflühen you have just conquered and the promising route ahead of you the next day.

Sporty variant: Stühlingen-Wutach Mühle, approximately 26 km



## Tip

From May to October, the steam trains on the Sauschwänzlebahn railway. The hiking trail crosses the railway line four times. When climbing the Buchberg, you can see the numerous hairpin bends that the train has to negotiate.

Diefurt Waterfall

Tour: ◀▶ 20.4 km ⌚ 6.5 h ▲ 450 m ▼ 500 m

Immerse yourself in the breathtaking adventure of the Wutach Gorge. Narrow paths run alongside the water, allowing you to cross the wild Wutach several times on footbridges or leading you along the rocks above the roaring torrent. Secure rock galleries and ladders with rope guardrails ensure your safety.

This stage begins with a small test of courage: a steep 8-metre staircase leads you into the small Schleifenbach gorge, whose waters plunge down three spectacular 20-metre waterfalls – a natural experience that will stay

with you forever! (Important note for all adventurers accompanied by their four-legged friends: you will find a detour for dogs on our website). You then continue to the mysterious Wutach outlet, where the infiltrated water gushes impressively and vividly out of the mountain. The valley around you becomes increasingly wild and narrow, the path winds its way over a carpet of roots directly along the Wutach, and the vegetation envelops you more and more in a primitive jungle atmosphere.

Majestic rock faces soon rise up on your left, secured by a metal cable guardrail. You can take a well-deserved break at the Schurhammerhütte rest area, where benches invite you to linger and recharge your batteries. The trail then winds its way through the rocks, past the roaring Tannegger waterfall and the remains of the old Bad Boll spa, until you reach your destination, the Schattenschlucht. From there, you can easily reach your well-deserved accommodation in Bonndorf, Löffingen, Bräunlingen or Hüfingen, either by bus, on foot or by arranging a lift with your host.

Sporty variant: Wutachmühle – Lenzkirch, approx. 26 km

### Tip

If you climb through the wild and romantic Lotenbachklamm gorge to the Lotenbachklamm hiking car park, you will enjoy a unique experience in the gorge (30 minutes longer) and can then take the bus to Bonndorf or Lenzkirch.

Tour: ◀▶ 19 km ⌚ 6h ▲ 750m ▼ 360m

From the Schattenmühle mill, you climb up to the northern edge of the Wutach Valley. Here, you can relax, take a deep breath and let your gaze wander over the vast expanses before descending back into the gorge. Soon, the mysterious remains of the Räuberschlößle appear on a high, imposing rock, nestled in one of the wildest and most impressive parts of the gorge. The majestic Räuberschlößle rock offers a breathtaking view: 80 metres below, the Wutach river foams – one

of the most captivating views of your hike through the gorge.

You can take a well-deserved break at the idyllic rest area at the mouth of the Rötenschbach, where benches and tables invite you to take a pleasant break in a picturesque natural setting. The path leading to the Haslach Gorge surprises with its exciting changes: sometimes you walk along the edge of the rushing water, sometimes you walk along the higher slope.

A raised footbridge allows you to cross the Wutach one last time before the path heads towards the wild and romantic Haslach Gorge. After passing the Rechenfelsen and Höllochfelsen rocks, which are well worth a detour, you will soon reach the charming village of Lenzkirch. Through the picturesque and peaceful Schwendetal valley, it is only a short distance from this traditional health resort to your final destination, Oberfischbach, where you can finally rest. You can either spend the night there or take the bus to Schluchsee, where you will find plenty of accommodation options.

#### Sporty variant:

#### Tip

Shortly before arriving, you will reach Saint Cyriac Chapel, located in an idyllic setting. The history of this chapel dates back to the 16th century.

Tour: ◀▶ 20 km ⌚ 6.5 h ▲ 390 m ▼ 670 m

Just a few kilometres from the start of the stage in Oberfischbach, the rocky peak of Bildstein rises above the fir and spruce forests. The highest viewpoint on the

entire Schluchtensteig trail offers a magnificent panorama: the view stretches from Feldberg to the sparkling Schluchsee lake and the distant Alps. Once a glacial lake,



Schluchsee was dammed and is now the highest dam in Germany – a paradise for swimming, water sports or a pleasant boat trip.

After skirting the western shore and stopping at the Vesperstube Unterkrummenhof, the trail leads back into peaceful forests. A moderate but steady climb leads to the highest point of the trail, the Krummenkreuz, where a clearing with a rest area invites you to take a break.

A nostalgic photo stop is a must in Muchenland, where old Black Forest farms tell tales of the past. Behind the mountain village of Althütte, the steep descent into the Alb Valley begins. Soon, the murmur of the Windberg waterfall can be heard, signalling that the grand finale of this stage is approaching. The trail winds along the Windbergbächle stream, passing over bridges and rocks.

On the outskirts of St. Blasien, the view opens up to the imposing St. Blaise Cathedral, which stands majestically between forests and mountains. It is here, in the well-tended parks on the peaceful banks of the Alb, that an eventful day of hiking comes to an end, full of nature, tranquillity and impressive views.

#### Tip

The impressive Blasiusdom cathedral of the former Benedictine monastery of St. Blasien is located directly on the trail and is definitely worth a visit, even if only brief. Its dome is one of the largest in Europe.

Rock of the pleasure pavilion

Tour: ◀▶ 19 km ⌚ 6 h ▲ 590 m ▼ 540 m

You begin your stage in the St. Blasien spa park and, after just a few minutes, you tackle the first ascent to the 1,039-metre-high Lehenkopf. After the Lusthausfelsen rock, you can enjoy one last impressive panorama of the imposing cathedral, the huge monastery and the charming spa town.

From the wooden observation tower at the top of Lehenkopf, you will be richly rewarded for your efforts: a breathtaking view stretches to the highest peak in the Black Forest, the Feldberg, and even to the Alps in the south. From Dachsberg, the trail leads into the open landscape characteristic of the Hotzenwald forest. Here, species-rich mountain meadows

protected by conservation measures shine in all their glory, dotted with a colourful carpet of wildflowers, and new panoramic views of the Swiss Alps open up constantly.

From the peaceful monastery pond, the trail climbs up to the vast Kreuzfelsen plateau, which attracts visitors with its mountain hut and breathtaking views, before continuing on to Ibach. After the Ibacher Kreuz, the landscape changes again. The Schluchtensteig winds its way in steep zigzags to the Hohwehraschlucht gorge, just outside the gates of the spa town and historic pilgrimage site of Todtmoos.

Wehr Gorge

Tour: ◀▶ 23 km ⌚ 8h ▲ 530m ▼ 980m



The final stage, which starts in Todtmoos and crosses the Wehr Gorge, begins gently and beautifully. After the hamlet of Schwarzenbach, where a stream murmurs, the trail passes through a mixed forest teeming with life. Once you reach the bottom of the valley, you cross the turbulent waters of the Wehra. The imposing rock faces of the protected forest rise up to 200 metres above the river roaring below. Here, you can see how the forest grows without human intervention. Breathtaking views from above or wide panoramas across the valley are constantly on offer. With a little luck, you may spot a few shy chamois elegantly climbing the steep walls.

At the idyllic rest area near the Mettlerhütte hut, you will once again have the opportunity to enjoy the breathtaking view of the Swiss Alps. The path then descends gradually until you cross the impressive dam of the Wehra reservoir. You then finish your hike in a relaxed manner along the river, passing the swimming pool, which invites you to cool off after this long and demanding hike, until you reach your final destination in the castle park. Here stand the old and new castles of the Lords of Schönau, in the heart of the historic town of Wehr, famous for its textile industry and weavers.

### Detour

If you walk the entire gorge trail, you will also pass through Bad Säckingen and Waldshut-Tiengen on the return transfer from Wehr to Stühlingen. It is worth taking a short break to visit the medieval historic centres.
